BAKER COUNTY





589 square miles



Estimated Population: 28,355 (2018)

Baker County has a quaint country atmosphere with all the conveniences of a big city nearby, with downtown Jacksonville being only a short 20-minute drive away. The region has preserved the beauty of old Florida, which can be readily explored in the Osceola National Forest that falls within the county's boundaries.

Glen St. Mary/Macclenny

If the fast-paced city life isn't your cup of tea, Glen St. Mary's smalltown atmosphere might just be the perfect spot for you. Approximately 420 people call Glen St. Mary home, with additional residents in the surrounding areas. Choose from family-friendly neighborhoods with single-family homes, larger properties with sprawling acreage and gated communities. The county seat of Baker County, Macclenny was established in 1890 but had settlers as early as 1829.

Today, the town has a population of around 6,400 and is located 35 miles west of Jacksonville. When looking for a home in this history-rich town, you will find several subdivisions that offer single-family homes and several apartment complexes.

Fleming Island

Fleming Island is a blossoming residential and commercial area that has unique, planned neighborhoods that provide centrally located amenities, some even within walking distance. Shopping centers, entertainment and restaurants are abundant here, bringing more convenience to those who have made Fleming Island home.

Green Cove Springs

Best known for its natural sulfur spring, Green Cove Springs is an easy-going town rich in history. Many older homes line the St. Johns River, and the town has seen the emergence of new housing developments within recent years. Residents participate in the city's many events, including the annual Memorial Day Riverfest.









Keystone Heights

In the southeast corner of Clay
County lies the lakeside community
of Keystone Heights. Home searchers

many parks and sand bottom lakes add
to the city's family-friendly appeal.



Middleburg

Middleburg has rapidly grown into a suburban community in central Clay County near Black Creek, a tributary of the St. Johns River. With Jennings State Forest close by, Middleburg residents enjoy hiking, biking, swimming and observing the area's natural scenery.



Orange Park

In the northeastern section of Clay County, Orange Park is a friendly town with everything from waterfront estates along the St. Johns River and Doctors Lake to new housing developments inland and rural homes on sprawls of land further to the west. Residents enjoy the many shopping and entertainment options as well as convenient access to I-295 and NAS Jacksonville.





Oakleaf Plantation

Situated in Clay County, with a small area lying in Duval County, OakLeaf Plantation is a family-oriented planned community with multiple village-style subdivisions.

OakLeaf Plantation residents have access to two athletic centers, which include baseball and soccer fields, tennis and basketball courts, and a water park. The OakLeaf Town Center is home to various retailers and restaurants. All the different neighborhoods within **Duval County and the** city of Jacksonville make it one of the most diverse parts of the First Coast. For your convenience, we have broken down the major areas into Beaches, North, South and West. Within each larger area that makes up Duval County are dozens of smaller neighborhoods.



DUVAL-BEACHES

This lively yet laid-back area is comprised of Jacksonville Beach, Neptune Beach, Atlantic Beach and Mayport. These tightknit seaside communities offer an assortment of residential areas with many beachfront properties. Jacksonville Beach has numerous clubs, bars and restaurants offering some of the best nightlife and

entertainment. Neptune Beach, the youngest and smallest of the beach communities, encompasses 2.5 square miles between Atlantic Beach and Jacksonville Beach. Through strict growth management benchmarks, Neptune Beach maintains a tranquil standard of living. Atlantic Beach is mostly residential, with a majority of the developed areas being singlefamily homes. Mayport is one of


the nation's oldest fishing villages and is located just north of Atlantic Beach. Here, freshly caught seafood (especially Mayport shrimp—a culinary staple on the First Coast) is readily available. Mayport offers many types of housing and apartments, which is convenient for military personnel and civilians who work at nearby Naval Station Mayport.

DUVAL-NORTH Arlington/Fort Caroline

Bordered by the St. Johns River to the west and north, the Intracoastal Waterway to the east and Atlantic Boulevard to the south, Jacksonville's Arlington/Fort Caroline area offers single- and multi-family developments, condominiums, townhomes, waterfront properties and golf communities. The community has a rich history, with European settlements dating back to the 1500s.

Northside/Oceanway

Consisting of neighborhoods north of the downtown area and a large portion of undeveloped land above the St. Johns River, the Northside offers quick access to the airport, the Jacksonville Zoo and River City Marketplace. Oceanway covers the northern section of Duval County, stretching from U.S. 1 to the Atlantic Ocean and from the Duval/Nassau county line to the St. Johns and Trout rivers. 



Mandarin

Named in 1830 after the area's major crop, Mandarin oranges, this historic neighborhood was once the home of Uncle Tom's Cabin author Harriet Beecher Stowe. Recognized for its majestic oak trees draped in Spanish moss, Mandarin has more water views than any other area in Jacksonville. Beauclerc and San Jose are two older neighborhoods that lie between the San Marco area and Mandarin, Most of the homes along Beauclerc Road are a mixture of architectural styles such as brick rambler homes and two-story contemporaries. San Jose has many historic homes built back in the 1950s and 1960s, along with new developments.

San Marco

Good-to-Know Info

If you're not only new to the First Coast, but to the state of Florida as well, check out this list of good-to-know information for car and homeowners.

Car Insurance

The mandatory minimum coverage for a registered motor vehicle is a \$10,000 personal injury protection (PIP) policy and a \$10,000 property damage liability (PDL) policy. The minimum coverage applies to all vehicles registered in the state of Florida, even if the vehicle is inoperable. Visit www.flhsmv.gov/insurance for any further info.

Driver's License and Motor Vehicles

Within 10 days of becoming employed, placing a child in public school or establishing residency in Florida, vehicles registered out of state are required to be registered in Florida and have a Florida license plate, a registration certificate and registration decal. You must apply for a Florida driver's license within 30 days of establishing residency in Florida to avoid fines and penalties. Visit www.flhsmv.gov for more info.

Property Taxes and Homestead Exemption

On the First Coast, property taxes are due in March and are considered delinquent as of April 1. Discounts are given for property taxes paid in advance. The maximum discount offered is 4 percent and applies to taxes paid in November. Late taxes are subject to penalty.

Legal Florida residents who own and reside on property are eligible for a homestead exemption up to \$50,000. This exemption applies to the first and third \$25,000 of the assessed value of the primary residence. The first \$25,000 applies to all property taxes, including school district taxes. The second exemption applies to assessed value over \$50,000 and only to non-school taxes. To be eligible, you must own and occupy your home as your permanent residence on January 1. The deadline to file is March 1. To apply for the exemption, go to your local Property Appraiser's office.

Termite Protection Contract

It's important for First Coast homeowners to be aware of the potential damage caused by termites, which are common throughout the state of Florida. When a pest control company completes a termite protection treatment, they must issue a termite protection contract. This contract is valid for a year and can be renewed up to four additional years. For new homes, the contract must include a warranty or guarantee that covers retreatment of the termite infested area if one occurs within one year of treatment, according to Florida law. If buying an older home, it is recommended, but not mandatory, to have a termite inspection and obtain a termite contract. 



Weather Prep

HURRICANES

The First Coast's humid subtropical climate can lead to some of nature's most powerful storms including hurricanes. Hurricane season is from the beginning of June to the end of November. They are most common during these months, although hurricanes can form throughout the year. Hurricanes are most threatening to coastlines, and as a peninsula, Florida has three. Typically, Northeast Florida receives fewer hurricanes than other parts of the state because it is the most western point on the U.S. Eastern Seaboard.

Weather Terms to Know:

Tropical Disturbance: originates in the tropics or subtropics and maintains an identity for 24 hours

Tropical Depression: maximum sustained wind speed of 38 mph

Tropical Storm: maximum sustained wind speeds of 39 to 73 mph

Hurricane: winds 74 mph and above

Hurricane Watch: hurricane conditions are possible within 48 hours in or near the

Hurricane Warning: hurricane conditions are expected within 36 hours in or near the warning area

Hurricane Categories:

Meteorologists use the Saffir-Simpson Hurricane Wind Scale to determine a hurricane's category and gauge the safety measures residents should take to prepare before the hurricane hits. Keep in mind this categorization scale does not determine other hurricane related impacts such as storm surge, rainfall-induced floods or tornadoes.

1: minimal; 74 to 95 mph winds

2: moderate; 96 to 110 mph winds

3: extensive; 111 to 129 mph winds

4: extreme; 130 to 156 mph winds

5: catastrophic; 157 mph and higher winds

Storm Preparations

Have a plan in place before a storm develops. Put together an emergency kit and keep it somewhere that is easily accessible. It is important to know your evacuation zone, and if you are in a mandatory evacuation zone, act immediately. In the event of an evacuation, have enough food and water for at least three days and have fuel in your car's gas tank. Highways and roads may be closed during evacuation, so plan out multiple travel routes. The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) weather radio provides comprehensive 24-hour weather forecasts.



Protect your home by boarding up windows and glass doors or installing hurricane shelters. Check your yard for any loose objects such as patio furniture, plants, toys and lawn tools. Any objects that are outdoors and not secured may fly away in high winds. Call your local emergency management or planning/zoning office to find out if you live in a potential flood zone. If so, consider stocking up on sandbags to keep water out of your home.

TORNADOES

Even though Northeast Florida's tornadoes are not typically as powerful as Midwestern ones, they can still cause significant damage. Tornadoes can reach 300 mph with an average forward speed of 30 mph. If a tornado warning occurs, take shelter immediately. When inside a building or home, stay inside a smaller inner room with no windows such as a bathroom or closet. Crouch low on the floor and cover your head with your hands. Tornadoes can develop rapidly, so advanced warning isn't always possible.

Navigating Senior Living Options

Seniors on the First Coast have so many types of living options to choose from! When searching for the best option for yourself or a loved one, it is important to know the differences between them in order to find the best fit.

Assisting Living Facilities

Assisting living facilities are a longterm care option for seniors who are no longer able to live at home safely but are still able to have some independence. Trained staff are there to help with tasks such as bathing, getting dressed, managing medications and grooming. These facilities are often structured like apartments and offer meals, activities and other amenities. Oftentimes there are large common areas and dining rooms so seniors can socialize. Staff are also there to assist with everyday activities and meals are offered in a common dining area for those who are not too sick or incapacitated. Memory care facilities are a specialized type of skilled nursing facility that accommodate seniors with Alzheimer's, dementia and other types of memory problems. They provide supervised care 24 hours a day in a comfortable and stress-free environment.

Retirement Communities

Encompassing a wide range of housing options for seniors, these communities are designed for seniors who can live as independently as possible. These include communities such as active

adult communities, independent living communities and 55-plus communities. Seniors will find a wide range of housing options like single-family homes, condos and apartments. While each retirement community is unique, they often have a number of amenities and conveniences such as fitness centers, pools, golf courses, transportation and a restaurant on site. These communities give seniors a sense of independence and freedom while also offering helpful services to assist with housekeeping and meal preparation if needed. Many retirement communities have an assisted living component.

Choosing the right living arrangement is a big decision but knowing the differences and similarities

For an environment that feels like home but still offers caregiving services and medical care, an assisted living facility is ideal for seniors who maintain some independence. Skilled nursing facilities are the best option for seniors who are recovering from an injury or illness and need intense medical care. Oftentimes once a senior recovers, they can be moved to an Assisted Living Facility. Essentially the senior's level of care required determines which facility is the best fit for them. Once you've determined which living option is right, tour different communities and ask about what services they provide and if anything costs extra.





Acreage Holdings

One of the largest vertically integrated cannabis operators in the country,
Acreage Holdings, has chosen Baker
County for its first production and cultivation facility in Florida. The new location will be an automated, climate-controlled facility for growing cannabis that will support Acreage's dispensaries in Florida. Acreage
Holdings chose Baker County for its

first Florida facility because of our warm climate and welcoming county officials. The facility will create up to 100 jobs for growth specialists, extraction personnel and maintenance.

Bentley Motors

British automaker Bentley Motors is building a new 40,987-square-foot dealership on Jacksonville's Southside off I-95 and Butler Boulevard. The dealership is projected to open sometime in 2020.

Bonelli Enterprises

San Francisco-based Bonelli Enterprises is planning to build a 72,102-square-foot window manufacturing factory at Jacksonville's Westside Industrial Park, which will support 135 jobs.

Champion Brands

In October 2019, Jacksonvillebased malt beverage distributor Champion Brands opened its \$6 million, 38,000-square-foot corporate headquarters on the city's Southside.

Durbin Park

St. Johns County is one of the fastestgrowing counties in the U.S. and The Pavilion at Durbin Park is a prime example of that. The first phase spans 650,000 square feet and includes Walmart, The Home Depot, Ross and Petco, in addition other great shops and restaurants. Construction is continuing on the 12-screen Cinemark movie theater. For the second phase, the owners are planning an urban village concept that will include a 150bed hospital, office space, commercial and retail space, 350 hotel rooms and 2,265 multifamily residential units.

Ecoco lax

Chicago-based natural hair products manufacturer Ecoco is opening a new factory in Jacksonville. The company is creating 150 jobs by the end of 2022 at an average salary of \$50,000 and is investing \$11 million into the project.

Emtec

IT services company Emtec Inc. moved its corporate headquarters from Pennsylvania to its Jacksonville location in September 2019. As a result, Emtec expects the employee headcount in Jacksonville to double over the next two years at its current location on the Southside. The firm

already provides IT strategy and consulting services to many prominent Jacksonville clients like JEA, Florida State College at Jacksonville and Duval County Public Schools.

Financial Technology Projects

Two new financial technology projects in Jacksonville will add nearly 500 new jobs for the city. San Francisco-based premium financial services platform SoFi is creating 300 jobs at an average salary of more than \$54,000 and investing \$5.5 million in a new office located in the Web.com building on the Southside. SS&C Technologies is expanding its operations at its existing

Southside office by investing \$1.7 million in capital expenditures. The expansion includes 198 new jobs that will offer an average wage of \$64,000. Both companies plan to hire all jobs by the end of 2021.



FIS Expansion

In November 2019, Jacksonville-based international financial technology services firm FIS announced that it will create 500 high-paying jobs and a new 300,000-square-foot headquarters in

downtown Jacksonville as part of its Project Sharp. The jobs will add to the more than 1,200 Jacksonville-based FIS employees, and the more than 55,000 employees worldwide serving more than 20,000 clients in 130 countries.

JinkoSolar

Shanghai-based JinkoSolar opened an advanced solar panel manufacturing facility at the Cecil Commerce Center in Jacksonville. The \$50 million facility will create 200 new jobs and produce two panels per minute, 24 hours a day, seven days a week. This will equal over 1 million panels per year. JinkoSolar chose Jacksonville for its

new facility because of its favorable tax climate and exceptional transportation infrastructure, including access to a deep-water port.

Margaritaville Beach Hotel

Construction has begun for the eightstory Margaritaville Beach Hotel in Jacksonville Beach. The resort-style hotel will be located on 1.14 acres and will have 200-plus rooms, a parking garage, pool and restaurant. The hotel is expected to open by late 2020 and will be a boost in the beach town's tourism.

VyStar Credit Union


VyStar Credit Union has relocated its corporate headquarters from suburban Jacksonville to downtown. VyStar bought the 23-story former SunTrust tower and the adjacent former Life of the South building at 100 W. Bay St. The VyStar name is now part of the downtown skyline since the credit union renamed the tower. VyStar is the nation's 15th largest credit union and has assets of more than \$9 billion.



Wawa Inc

Wawa Inc. officially took up residence in Northeast Florida when it opened its first convenience stores in Duval and Clay counties in December 2018. Dozens more are expected to follow over the next few years. The company has reported that St. Johns County and Nassau County may also see new Wawa stores in the future.

HEALTHCARE EXPANSIONS

Brooks Rehabilitation

Brooks Rehabilitation has announced that it will add a new state-of-theart inpatient rehabilitation hospital to its Bartram Park campus in order to meet the need of an expanding population. The addition of this 60-bed hospital will allow Brooks to provide a continuum of care for its patients, all at one convenient location. The Bartram campus also includes a skilled nursing facility, an assisted living facility and two memory care homes. Brooks expects hospital construction to be completed in two years and is looking to hire 150 employees once the hospital is fully operational.

UF Health in Wildlight

UF Health is growing its presence in the Wildlight neighborhood in Nassau County. There the health system opened a 40,000-square-foot medical office building in December 2019. With a focus on prevention and early diagnosis, patients will have access to urgent care, imaging services, pediatrics, obstetrics and gynecology, mental health services, dentistry and a laboratory. UF Health's second major project, UF Health Rehabilitation -Wildlight, will offer rehab services for adults and pediatrics, including physical and occupational therapy, and speech language pathology. There will also be a healthy living center and a YMCA fitness center. UF Health Rehabilitation - Wildlight will be located in the center of the community and is projected to open spring 2020.

Rendina Healthcare Real Estate and Twin Creeks Development **Associates**

Nationwide real estate developer for health systems and physician groups Rendina Healthcare Real Estate has partnered with Twin Creeks Development Associates to develop a 60,000-square-foot medical office building as part of the Beachwalk master-planned community in northern St. Johns County. This will provide convenient access to medical care for the residents of Beachwalk and the surrounding St. Johns County communities.

Naval Air Station Jacksonville

The First Coast is proud to be the home of Naval Air Station Jacksonville (NAS Jacksonville), the largest Navy base in the Southeast and the third largest in the nation, NAS Jacksonville has an annual regional economic impact of \$2.1 billion. The Navy base is a 2012 Presidential Excellence Award and 2013 Commander, Navv Installations Command Excellence Award. Located on nearly 4,000 acres along the beautiful St. Johns River on the Westside, NAS Jacksonville is an operational headquarters for more than 100 tenant commands and is home to the largest squadron in the Navy—Patrol Squadron Thirty (VP-30). Major tenants aboard the base include Commander, Navy Region Southeast; Fleet Readiness Center Southeast; Naval Facilities Engineering Command Southeast; Naval Hospital Jacksonville; and Naval Supply Fleet Logistics Center, NAS Jacksonville's Fleet and Family Readiness division includes many Morale, Welfare and Recreation programs and services such as fitness centers, pools, the NAS Jacksonville Golf Course, bowling, the Mulberry Cove Marina, outdoor recreation, restaurants and discount tickets for special events.

Naval Station Mayport

With a mission of sustaining and enhancing warfighter readiness, Naval Station Mayport (NS Mayport) is one of three major Navy installations in the Jacksonville area. The seaport and air facility spans more than 3,400 acres and is the third largest naval facility in the continental U.S. The Navy's 4th Fleet is also headquartered in NS Mayport. The naval station's harbor can hold 34 ships and has an 8,000-foot runway that can handle any Department of Defense aircraft. The station's airfield is operated and maintained by NS Mayport's Air Operations Department and conducts more than 100,000 helicopter and fixed-wing flights each year. The naval station has more than 80 tenant commands, including six helicopter squadrons and 22 naval ships. The NS Mayport Morale, Welfare and Recreation Department provides a wide variety of high-quality services, facilities, recreational programs and activities. The Mayport Beacon, located on the beach, offers numerous activities and programs and is home to

the Loggerheads Pub.

Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay

Located just 35 miles north of Jacksonville in Georgia, Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay (NSB Kings Bay) is an integral part of the Jacksonville military community. The nearly 17,000-acre installation is the only Navy base on the East Coast capable of supporting the Trident II (D-5) Missile, a fundamental part of our nation's strategic deterrence program. The base tenant commands include the Naval Submarine Support Center, Submarine Group 10, Trident Training Facility, Trident Refit Facility, and Strategic Weapons Facility, Atlantic. Currently, the base berths eight Ohioclass submarines: six Ballistic Missile Submarines and two Guided Missile Submarines. On base, sailors and their families have access to Morale, Welfare, and Recreation programs and services including a golf course, bowling, childcare, dining, computers, trips, special functions and more.

United States Coast Guard Sector Jacksonville

Adjacent to NS Mayport, the United States Coast Guard Sector Jacksonville is located on six acres of land and is accountable for 40,000 square miles of ocean and inland waterways, including 190 miles of coastline from Kings Bay, Georgia to Port Malabar, Florida. All Coast Guard missions that fall into this area are Sector Jacksonville's responsibility. As the sub-office of the Coast Guard's 7th District Headquarters in Miami, the unit utilizes Multi-Mission Mayport and Security Detachment Mayport, as well as Station Ponce de Leon Inlet and Station Cape Canaveral to successfully cover this large area. Post-Sept. 11, 2001 legislative changes changed Coast Guard status from operating under the Department of Transportation to operating under the Department of Homeland Security. The Coast Guard is considered a military service because the U.S. President can transfer any or all assets of the Coast Guard to the Department of the Navy during times of war or conflict. This has been done in almost every single conflict involving the U.S.














OUR GATEWAY TO THE WORLD: Ports of the First Coast


With our location and access to numerous waterways, interstates and railroads, Jacksonville has established itself as a titan of logistics and distribution. More than 70 million consumers are within a day's driving distance and international customers are able to receive goods faster than ever. Many logistics and distribution companies have settled in the area and operate out of our ports, including CEVA Logistics, Coach Inc., Crowley Maritime Corporation, Mediterranean Shipping Company and Landstar Shipping.

PORTS

JAXPORT

Jacksonville Port Authority (JAXPORT) is often referred to as the "global gateway to Florida." It is made up of three marine terminals, including Blount Island, Dames Point and Talleyrand. From JAXPORT, ocean carriers can travel to 140 ports located in 70 countries. The port authority also helps shippers transport their goods using 100 trucking firms and 40 daily trains. Numerous cruises depart from the port authority, including the Carnival Ecstasy, which offers yearround service and four- and five-day excursions to the Bahamas.

According to JAXUSA, JAXPORT was voted No. 1 for Customer Satisfaction and Performance by Logistics
Management in August 2019. Also in 2019, JAXPORT set a volume record and moved more than 1.338 million 20-foot equivalent units. This is a 5 percent increase from 2018. The port authority also moved the most vehicles in history totaling nearly 696,500 total units.
For more than 70 million consumers, Jacksonville is only a day's drive away, making it the prime location for distributors to operate out of and call home.

The Blount Island Marine Terminal is JAXPORT's largest facility, as well as one of the largest vehicle import/ export centers in the nation. It is also home to one of the highest weightbearing capacity docks. Recently, the federal government awarded the port authority \$20 million to repave the SSA Jacksonville Container Terminal here. Dames Point Marine Terminal is the newest terminal in the area and has 5,002 linear feet of deep-water berths, as well as six new Panamax container cranes. The terminal also houses the Carnival Cruise Lines' Elation, a 2,130-passenger cruise liner. Talleyrand Marine Terminal is run by the Jacksonville Port Terminal Railroad Inc. and mostly deals with

breakbulk cargoes, such as lumber, paper and steel, vehicles and liquid bulk commodities. It's located on the St. Johns River.

Port of Fernandina

The Port of Fernandina currently provides terminal service to over 14 pulp and paper producers throughout Florida and the Southeast. The port also provides steel export services to steel companies with mills in the Southeastern United States. To enhance the port and accommodate customers, \$15 million in capital investments are dedicated to modernizing the on-dock paper warehouse, adding equipment, such as cranes, and extending the berth. The port authority will also

be adding a Foreign Trade Zone destination. Due to the location of the Port of Fernandina, the Ocean, Highway & Port Authority works to establish connections to interstate, rail and air services to deliver more goods and services internationally.

LOGISTICS & DISTRIBUTION

Jacksonville is home to one of the top non-asset-based supply chain management companies with the largest freight network in the nation, CEVA Logistics. The CEVA Jacksonville location was specifically designed to enhance logistic innovation in order to increase power supply chain efficiency, which allows organizations to witness said efficiency in action.

Coach Inc.'s primary distribution center is located in Jacksonville at the Jacksonville International Tradeport. The fashion and accessory brand has been conducting their business out of the First Coast since 1995 and has tripled in size since. This 850,000-square-foot location is at the forefront of sustainability initiatives for the company and was awarded Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design certification in

Known for their speed and efficiency in shipping and distribution, Crowley Maritime Corporation has made a name for themselves on the First Coast. Crowley has two locations in the area and ships to several countries in the Caribbean and Central America, as well as Puerto Rico. The company has six operating lines of business, which include deep sea petroleum transportation; distribution and petroleum transportation, sales in Alaska; logistics; marine contract solutions and Puerto Rico/Caribbean and Latin America liner services.

The world's second largest shipping company when it comes to container vessel capacity, Mediterranean Shipping Company (MSC) is a leader in global container shipping and logistics. MSC also ships on the local level. The company calls out of 500 ports, including JAXPORT, and also utilizes an integrated network of road and rail transport resources. Their fleet is equipped with the most up-to-date eco-friendly technologies.

Based in Jacksonville, Landstar Shipping is a leader in supply chain solutions and global and domestic transportation. The company is proud of their "safety-first culture" and maintains a 99 percent claim-free delivery rate. This logistical industry leader is composed of independent agents and transportation capacity providers.

E-PASS is run by the Central Florida Expressway Authority. The E-PASS sticker is free but must be loaded with \$10 to activate. E-PASS is available to purchase online, over the phone or at the E-PASS Service Center in Orlando.

First Coast Expressway

The tolls on the First Coast Expressway are:

Those who do not pay the toll will be charged a toll-by-plate fee.

I-295 Express Lanes

The express toll lanes on I-295 West stretch over 4 miles starting at I-95 to the Buckman Bridge. Toll prices are determined on how busy the roads are and signs will display the price above the lanes. Drivers will only be charged on weekdays from 6 a.m. to 10 a.m. and from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. Cash or toll-by-plate is not accepted in the express lanes. Express lane construction along I-295 from JTB to SR 9B is expected to be complete by Fall 2020.

JTA provides various mass transit services for the public in Duval County, including paratransit for the disabled and elderly, and Ride Request on-demand services.

Bus – JTA manages all bus services in the greater Jacksonville area. The JTA website features updated information about each route daily, including a specific time for each stop, making it more convenient than ever to take public transportation.

Connexion (Paratransit) – The paratransit service provides destination-to-destination shared transportation for disabled and disadvantaged individuals. JTA provides this service to supplement fixed bus routes around the city in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Connexion Plus is for eligible customers who want private, sameday, door-to-door service anywhere in Duval County.

Park-n-Ride – Created to make going to downtown Jacksonville a breeze, this coordinated JTA effort has designated lots around the city with express service to downtown. The Stadium Shuttle provides transportation to and from the stadium for major sporting events. These buses run continuously so whenever you're ready to leave, you will have a guaranteed ride back to your car.

ReadiRide – Offered by JTA through Owl Inc., ReadiRide is an on-call service that provides affordable transportation to customers at the Arlington, Beaches, Highlands, Mandarin, Northside, Southeast and Southwest areas. You can use the MyJTA app for further convenience.

Skyway – This free automated train allows riders to glide high above traffic for convenient access around downtown Jacksonville. There are eight train stations and trains depart every four minutes during peak hours (6 to 9 a.m. and 4 to 7 p.m.) and every eight minutes during off-peak hours. The Skyway also has special hours, running until 9:30 p.m., on the first Wednesday of each month for a convenient trip to Art





BEACHES

DUVAL COUNTY

Atlantic Beach

Visitors to charming Atlantic Beach can enjoy numerous saltwater activities such as paddleboarding, kayaking, surfing or fishing. After a day of fun in the sun, head to Atlantic Beach's local boutiques, upscale restaurants and bars.

Jacksonville Beach

Jacksonville Beach, or Jax Beach, is one of the most popular spots for families, vacationers and surfers.

Nestled between Neptune and Ponte Vedra beaches, Jax Beach offers public beach access and nearby parking.

Encompassing about 60 blocks along the Atlantic Ocean, Jax Beach is more than four miles wide and lined by small soft dunes.

Mayport

North of Atlantic Beach is the historic fishing village of Mayport, which is located at the mouth of the St. Johns River and well known for its shrimping industry. In the Mayport area is the beachfront Kathryn Abbey Hanna Park, which many locals say has the best surfing waves in Northeast Florida.

Neptune Beach

North of Jax Beach is the quaint beachside community of Neptune Beach. Even though the beach is only about a mile long, visitors enjoy surfing, basking in the sun and peaceful bike rides on the beach's hard-packed sand.

NASSAU COUNTY

Fernandina Beach

The First Coast's northernmost beach, Fernandina Beach on Amelia Island is perfect for seashell hunting, sunbathing and horseback riding.



Travel south of Fernandina Beach to American Beach, which was originally established as a vacation destination for African Americans during the time of racial segregation and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

ST. JOHNS COUNTY

Crescent Beach

Located on Anastasia Island just south of St. Augustine on A1A, Crescent Beach gets its name from the coastline's natural crescent shape. The beach's hard-packed sand is perfect for horseback riding, bike rides and beach volleyball.

North Beach

With a full range of facilities including parking, boat ramps and showers, North Beach is a serene spot for sunbathing and beachcombing.

Ponte Vedra Beach

The quieter and less crowded Ponte Vedra Beach is located along the northern portion of the county and has various convenient beach access



points. In South Ponte Vedra Beach, the shore is beautifully lined with sand dunes and is a great spot for those looking for shark teeth and seashells. Mickler's Landing in Ponte Vedra is a popular beach destination for surfers and families.

St. Augustine Beach

St. Augustine Beach has everything for a fun day of surf and sand, with cozy beachside restaurants, a beachfront park, fishing pier, pavilion, splash park, and beach volleyball courts.

Vilano Beach

Vilano Beach is located on the north side of the Matanzas Inlet and has a dune walkover, covered picnic tables, showers and more. Its location near the inlet allows for heavier surf and a strong current, making it a great surfing and skimboarding spot on the First Coast. The Vilano Beach pier is a great spot for catching some fish while enjoying a quiet afternoon by the water.


WATERWAYS

The Intracoastal

Splitting Jacksonville's southside region from the beach communities, the Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway runs 40 miles through the First Coast. The waterway's saltwater inlets, sounds and man-made canals are open to recreational vessels and provide opportunities to explore the area's natural beauty. Residents enjoy a wide range of water activities such as boating, fishing, kayaking, paddle boarding, jet skiing and tubing.

St. Johns River

Truly a First Coast icon, the St. Johns River is the longest river in Florida and one of the few in the U.S. that flows north. Spanning 310 miles from Indian River County to Mayport, residents and visitors can enjoy a variety of activities on the lazy river such as fishing, boating and kayaking. You may even spot a dolphin or manatee. The Riverwalk allows for residents to take a relaxing stroll along the beautiful river.



Other First Coast Rivers

Other First Coast rivers provide for fishing, scenic boating and other activities. On Amelia River, boaters can take in the sights of historic sites such as Fort Clinch State Park. Down in St. Johns County, the Tolomato and Guana rivers surround Guana Tolomato Matanzas National Estuarine Research Reserve. In St. Augustine, sail around the Matanzas Bay and River to see landmarks like the Castillo de San Marcos, the Bridge of Lions and the St. Augustine Lighthouse.

BAKER COUNTY

John M. Bethea State Forest

Push off into the St. Marys River or fish at any of the small ponds at the John M. Bethea State Forest where you can experience serene bliss and maybe catch sight of the wildlife in the area.

Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge

Spanning nearly 400,000 acres, the Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge is one of the world's largest freshwater ecosystems. While enjoying their guide boat tours or trails, keep an eye out for alligators, black bears and the other 400-plus creatures that call the forest and swamps home.

Osceola National Forest

Offering a ton of activities including camping, hiking, swimming, fishing and hunting, the Osceola National Forest is truly a treasure for the outdoorsy individual.

CLAY COUNTY

Jennings State Forest

Home to more than 15 biological communities, the Jennings State Forest offers visitors the chance to experience a variety of activities including hiking, horseback riding, cycling, camping and fishing.

Mike Roess Gold Head Branch State Park

Two thousand acres of ravines, marshes, sandhills, lakes and scrub provide a kind of serenity that you can't find in the city. Walk along the Florida National Scenic Trail or spend the day by the water fishing, canoeing or swimming.



DUVAL-NORTH

Amelia Island State Park

A favorite for equestrians, Amelia Island State Park is a beautiful beachside park that is one of the few beaches that allows horseback riding. Visitors can also search for seashells, fish or look for local wildlife.

Big Talbot Island State Park

With spooky "skeletons" of oak and cedar trees, Big Talbot Island offers a unique backdrop for photographers at Boneyard Beach. Visitors can also explore the area by boat while keeping an eye out for the numerous birds that call Big Talbot home.

Fort George Island Cultural State Park

Named after a fort that defended the southern flank of Georgia, Fort George Island is a great place for outdoor activities like boating, fishing, hiking and off-road cycling. While there, take a visit to the Ribault Club, which used to be an exclusive resort and now doubles as a visitor center and event space.

George Crady Bridge Fishing Pier State Park

Open 24 hours a day year-round, this mile-long bridge is the perfect spot for those looking to spend the day fishing. There are a multitude of species to catch, including drum, jack, tarpon and whiting.

Little Talbot State Park

Located next to Big Talbot Island, this state park is home to five miles of gorgeous white beaches, untouched salt marshes and animals like river otters, bobcats, and native and



DUVAL-BEACHES

Kathryn Abbey Hanna Park

Within the nearly 500 acres that make up Hanna Park, visitors can find The Poles, Northeast Florida's premier surfing spot, the Kids Splash Park, hiking and biking trails and 1.5 miles of gorgeous beaches.

Our state parks make up more than 80,000 acres, making it the largest urban park system in the country! migratory birds. Visitors can rent a kayak and go on one of the guided paddle tours or break out the tent and spend a night in the full-facility campgrounds.

Pumpkin Hill Creek Preserve State Park

Pumpkin Hill Creek is a great place for equestrians and animal lovers. With five miles of multi-use trails, take a walk or ride a horse and keep an eye out for the Florida animals that call this place home. Or for a day on the water, push off into the salt marsh in a kayak for a little peace and quiet.

Timucuan Ecological and Historic Preserve

History and nature collide at the Timucuan Ecological and Historical Preserve. Explore the dunes, salt marshes and hardwood hammocks that used to be home to the Timucuan tribe. The preserve is also home to the Kingsley Plantation and Fort Caroline.

NASSAU COUNTY

Cary State Forest

Enjoy a day of picnicking and outdoorsy activities at Cary State Forest, whose flatwoods, sandhills and basin marsh are home to gopher tortoises, wood storks and Sherman's fox squirrel, among others.

Four Creeks State Forest

This state forest is named after the four water systems located within its 10,959 acres: Alligator (Mills), Thomas, Boggy and Plummer creeks. Visitors are welcome to bike, fish, hike and kayak throughout the property.

ST. JOHNS COUNTY

Anastasia State Park

Search for seashells along the four miles of pristine beaches or spend the day in the cool water at the Anastasia State Park, where you can also visit the site where the coquina rock for the Castillo de San Marcos fortress was mined. The park also has a full-facility campground for those looking to extend their stay.





Faver-Dykes State Park

A popular location for birdwatchers, Faver-Dykes State Park is home to more than 100 species of birds during the spring and fall months. The park also has places for camping, canoeing, fishing and walking.


Guana Tolomato Matanzas National Estuarine Research Reserve

The French Huguenots led by French explorer Jean Ribault landed near the St. Johns River in 1562 but traveled north to present day South Carolina to establish a colony that would ultimately fail. Meanwhile, René Goulaine de Laudonnière, Ribault's second-in-command, led a contingent of new settlers back to Florida where they founded Fort Caroline in 1564. However the recently appointed Spanish Governor of Florida, Pedro Menéndez de Avilés, had been given orders to remove the French and the fort was destroyed. In 1565, Menéndez founded St. Augustine at the site of the Timucuan village, Seloy. Within a century, the city was attacked twice. Even with these setbacks, the determined early settlers of St. Augustine stayed and rebuilt after each attack. In 1763 at the end of the Seven Years' War, Spain gave their vast Florida territory to the British in order to keep the city of Havana, Cuba.

Under British control, the First Coast saw a period of active development, with plantations springing up along the St. Johns River. The British built the King's Trail (now U.S. 1), a route that connected St. Augustine to Georgia. The settlement was the narrowest place along the trail to ford livestock across the St. Johns River, thereby earning the region the name Cowford. Many British loyalists settled in the area during the Revolutionary War, however by 1783, the British were forced to return control of the Florida Colony to the Spanish. This Spanish rule would not prove to be as successful as the first. After several attempts to oust the Spanish from the Florida colony, including intrusions by Andrew Jackson, Spain ceded Florida to the U.S. in 1821. In honor of Andrew Jackson's service as Florida territory's military governor, Cowford was eventually renamed Jacksonville.

During reconstruction following the Civil War, Northeast Florida began to capitalize on its pristine beaches and warm weather by marketing the First Coast as a premier winter destination. The area became a popular resort area for the rich and famous, ushering in a time of rapid economic growth. The first World War marked an entirely new level of economic growth due to increased military presence.

Today, the First Coast remains a part of this history: a byproduct of so much that occurred before its conception and an accumulation of everything that came after.

The Battle of Olustee fought on Feb. 20, 1864 was the largest Civil War battle in Florida, with more than 10,000 cavalry, infantry and artillery troops fighting for five hours. The end results were 2,807 casualties and a Union retreat to Jacksonville. The battlefield became the state's first historic site and a reenactment is held every February.
