



Dear Friends:

During my time as Governor, we have invested millions to raise the minimum K-12 teacher salary and we have increased salaries for veteran teachers and other instructional personnel, ensuring that we can recruit and retain top teacher talent. During the 2020-2021 school year, every kid in Florida had access to in-person education. To thank Florida's educators who showed up for their students, we also provided \$1,000 bonuses to all teachers and principals in the state. 




The First Coast is fortunate to have a wide variety of neighborhoods and communities for newcomers to choose from. To help you traverse this vast region, we have put together descriptions of each neighborhood within the five First Coast counties, including Baker, Clay, Duval, Nassau and St. Johns.

Whether you're on the hunt for a house in the country, a beachside cottage, a new home in a master-planned community, a charming historic home, or a high-rise condominium in downtown Jacksonville, the First Coast has it all!









Southwest of Jacksonville and west of historic St. Augustine, Clay County is a diverse mixture of suburban neighborhoods and up-and-coming communities. The area is a popular destination for nature lovers due to its scenic trails, immense wildlife and bountiful waterways.

FLEMING ISLAND

This thriving community continues to attract newcomers year after year. The area is home to major housing developments including Eagle Harbor, Fleming Island Plantation and Pace Island. Residents also enjoy access to a bustling commercial area filled with shopping centers, entertainment and restaurants. Black Creek Park located on the south side of **Fleming Island** borders Black Creek, which is full of nature trails for both hikers and bikers.

GREEN COVE SPRINGS


Originally established in 1854 as White Sulfur Springs, **Green Cove Springs** is a friendly community filled with rich history. Its natural sulfur springs flow into the St. Johns River where many older homes line the river. Recently, the city has seen an arrival of new housing developments as the population grows.

Granary Park is a new 290-acre community coming to Green Cove Springs that will consist of 770 single-family homesites. Once complete, the community will offer residents a variety of high-end amenities, including a clubhouse, oasis-style pool, fitness studio, a spacious playground and a dog park. From the developers that built Nocatee and eTown, Parc Group is planning to develop a new master-planned community in the area known as **Governors Park**. The community will span more than 3,000 acres and will include about 4,000 homes as well as a mix of retail and offices.

KEYSTONE HEIGHTS

The lakeside community of **Keystone Heights** is full of old-town charm.
Located in the southeast corner of
Clay County, prospective residents
will find tree-lined streets, cozy
cottages, single-family homes and
plenty of undeveloped land. The city
has a family-friendly appeal with many
parks and beautiful sand bottom lakes,
including Lake Geneva.







OAKLEAF PLANTATION

Oakleaf Plantation is a familyoriented planned community with multiple village-style subdivisions situated in Clay County, with a small area falling into Duval County. The plantation offers newcomers singleand multi-family homes, luxury condominiums and apartments. Oakleaf Plantation sits on more than 6,000 acres of land that includes a dedicated nature preserve with almost 1,500 acres of untouched wildlife. Nature lovers will also enjoy being adjacent to Jennings State Forest, which has a diverse number of paths and trails. The bustling Oakleaf Town Center has various shopping and restaurant options.



GrevHawk is a new 800-acre, master-planned community near Branan Field Wildlife Area in in the Oakleaf area. The community boasts a number of amenities, including a fitness studio, dog park, basketball court, tennis courts, a pool, a playground and walking paths.

Eagle Landing at Oakleaf

Plantation is a resort-style community that sits nearby beautiful Jennings State Forest. It has a variety of new home styles ranging from traditional to contemporary with an abundance of amenities. Residents can hit the links at the 18-hole championship golf course designed by Clyde Johnson, a renowned golf course architect. Eagle Landing allows golf cart access everywhere within the community, which makes it much easier to navigate the area. The community offers "dive-in" movies, golf clinics, tennis leagues and summer camps at the amenity complex. Residents can also take advantage of a full-size gym with a fitness center, golf clubhouse, Swim Park, Kid's Club, eight lighted Har-Tru tennis courts and a village store with a café. Residents also have access to A-rated schools as well as Ascension St. Vincent's Clay County Hospital.

ORANGE PARK

Located in the northeastern section of Clay County, Orange Park offers all the advantages of big city living with a small-town pace of life. Housing options include everything from waterfront estates along the St. Johns River and Doctors Lake to new developments inland. 

NORTHSIDE/OCEANWAY



MANDARIN

Once the home of famous author Harriet Beecher Stowe, Mandarin is a historic neighborhood located in the southern part of Jacksonville. VILANO BEACH





Good-to-Know Info

If you're not only new to the First Coast, but to the state of Florida as well, check out this list of good-to-know information for car and homeowners.

Car Insurance

The mandatory minimum coverage for a registered motor vehicle is a \$10,000 personal injury protection (PIP) policy and a \$10,000 property damage liability (PDL) policy. The minimum coverage applies to all vehicles registered in the state of Florida, even if the vehicle is inoperable. Visit www.flhsmv.gov/insurance for any further info.

Driver's License and Motor Vehicles

Within 10 days of becoming employed, placing a child in public school or establishing residency in Florida, vehicles registered out of state are required to be registered in Florida and have a Florida license plate, a registration certificate and registration decal. You must apply for a Florida driver's license within 30 days of establishing residency in Florida to avoid fines and penalties. Visit www.flhsmv.gov for more info.

Property Taxes and Homestead Exemption

On the First Coast, property taxes are due in March and are considered delinquent as of April 1. Discounts are given for property taxes paid in advance. The maximum discount offered is 4 percent and applies to taxes paid in November. Late taxes are subject to penalty. See our list of tax collector's offices on this page.

Legal Florida residents who own and reside on property are eligible for a homestead exemption up to \$50,000. This exemption applies to the first and third \$25,000 of the assessed value of the primary residence. The first \$25,000 applies to all property taxes, including school district taxes. The second exemption applies to assessed value over \$50,000 and only to non-school taxes. To be eligible, you must own and occupy your home as your permanent residence on January 1. The deadline to file is March 1. To apply for the exemption, go to your local Property Appraiser's office.

Termite Protection Contract

It's important for First Coast homeowners to be aware of the potential damage caused by termites, which are common throughout the state of Florida. When a pest control company completes a termite protection treatment, they must issue a termite protection contract. This contract is valid for a year and can be renewed up to four additional years. For new homes, the contract must include a warranty or guarantee that covers retreatment of the termite infested area if one occurs within one year of treatment, according to Florida law. If buying an older home, it is recommended, but not mandatory, to have a termite inspection and obtain a termite contract. First Coast Apartment Living

The First Coast is a wonderful place for those looking to rent an apartment. This past year, the residential rental market here has grown and expanded. There are 43 apartment complexes expected to open on the First Coast over the next three years, according to the NAI Hallmark Jacksonville Metro Q2 2021 Market Report.

The First Coast has hit record highs for annual rent growth. According to the NAI Market Report, the average monthly rent is \$1,231 for the Jacksonville MSA, an 11.5 percent increase from last year. This annual rent growth rate is the largest in more than a quarter-century and is the seventh largest rent increase among major markets nationally. Additionally, apartments are being rented out fast. The current vacancy rate is 3.7 percent, down from 5.2 percent last year.

Over the past five years, Jacksonville's market-rate multifamily inventory increased by 18 percent, according to the First Coast Apartment Association (FCAA). While there have been challenges with the construction supply pipeline due to the pandemic, the FCAA predicts that this won't affect apartment construction, and groundbreaking may likely increase over the next year. The Southside (the area's largest submarket) has accounted for about 30 percent of the area's construction supply pipeline. Other First Coast submarkets are adding significant supply, and more than half are building at a rate higher than the national average.





Preparing for Your New Apartment







Weather Prep

Storm Preparations

Being prepared with emergency supplies and a plan can help reduce stress in the wake of a storm. Assemble a disaster supply kit and keep it in an easily accessible place including a first aid kit and at least a three-day supply of food and water. Items such as flashlights and a National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) weather radio are helpful to have to stay up to date on comprehensive 24-hour weather forecasts. Keep a full tank of gas and plan multiple travel routes out of the area. Besides learning your evacuation zone, keep in mind that if an evacuation does occur, highways, bridges and roads may close.

Protect your home by boarding up glass doors or windows with plywood or installing hurricane shutters. Collect any loose objects from the yard as they are a hazard and could fly away during high winds. The local emergency management or planning/zoning office can alert you if you live in a potential flood zone and give suggestions for additional preparation such as getting sandbags to prevent water from getting into your house.

HURRICANES

Hurricane season begins in June and lasts until the end of November and although most common during those months, hurricanes can form throughout the year. With three peninsulas, Florida gets the brunt of the storms on its coastlines, which are most threatened by these storms. As the most western point on the U.S. Eastern Seaboard, Northeast Florida receives fewer hurricanes than other parts of the state.

Weather Terms to Know:

Hurricane Warning:

hurricane conditions are expected within 36 hours in or near the warning area.

Hurricane Watch:

hurricane conditions are possible within 48 hours in or near the watch area.

Hurricane: winds 74 mph and above.

Tropical Storm: maximum sustained wind speeds of 39 to 73 mph.

Tropical Depression: maximum sustained wind speed of 38 mph.

Tropical Disturbance:

originates in the tropics or subtropics and maintains an identity for 24 hours.

Hurricane Categories:

The Saffir-Simpson Hurricane Wind Scale is used by meteorologists to define a hurricane's category and determine safety measures that residents should take for hurricane preparation or even evacuation. This categorization scale doesn't determine other possible hurricane-related effects such as storm surge, tornadoes or flooding due to the increase of rain.

1: minimal; 74 to 95 mph winds

2: moderate; 96 to 110 mph winds

3: extensive; 111 to 129 mph winds

4: extreme; 130 to 156 mph winds

5: catastrophic; 157 mph and higher winds

TORNADOES

Compared to the Midwest, tornadoes on the First Coast aren't nearly as strong, but can still cause significant damage. Tornadoes can reach 300 mph with an average forward speed of 30 mph. If a tornado warning is issued, make sure to take shelter indoors away from the storm. When inside a building or home, stay away from windows in an inner room such as a bathroom or closet. Crouch low to the ground and cover your head with your hands. Stay aware of severe weather in the area, as tornadoes can develop quickly and advanced warning isn't always possible.

The four medical campuses are UF Health Jacksonville in downtown Jacksonville, UF Health North near Jacksonville International Airport, UF Health Emerson Medical Plaza on the southside of Jacksonville and UF Health Wildlight in Yulee. These encompass more than 60 practices throughout the area offering primary and specialty care services.

UF Health Jacksonville is a full-service hospital and home to the only Level I trauma program in the area, 24/7 emergency room and Level III neonatal intensive care unit. Some specialty care services on-site are cardiology, obstetrics and gynecology, neurosurgery, orthopaedics, rehabilitation services and many more. The University of Florida Colleges of Medicine, Nursing and Pharmacy are also located on the UF Health Jacksonville campus.

UF Health North is home to the only full-service hospital in North Florida, a 24/7 emergency room, and 12 state-of-the-art labor and delivery suites. Also on this campus is the Medical Office Building, offering more than 30 specialty services including outpatient surgery, laboratory and diagnostic services.

UF Health Emerson Medical Plaza is home to a multiservice outpatient care center. Rehabilitation services include physical, speech, occupational and neurological therapies. A variety of additional specialties are available, from cardiology and neurosciences to endocrinology and imaging services. Patients also have access to primary care and health screening services.



Opened in December 2019, UF Health Wildlight is the newest outpatient medical facility and is the official medical provider for the Wildlight Community. This campus offers urgent care, dentistry, family medicine, pediatrics, mental health services, obstetrics and gynecology, imaging, and a laboratory. A new rehabilitation facility opened in the fall of 2020 and offers occupational, physical and speech therapies for adults and children. The facility is also home to a healthy living center and a YMCA.



New VA Hospital Coming to the First Coast

Soon, our area's veterans will have more access to top-notch medical services and healthcare. The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs will be opening a new VA medical center on the Northside near River City Marketplace. It will replace two smaller VA centers in the area, one on Southpoint Drive and one on University Boulevard at the Memorial Health Plaza.

Healthcare on the First Coast is Thriving!

The Jacksonville area is experiencing a growth in economic and job opportunities that is unprecedented. Over the last year, Jacksonville's job market has experienced an increase of 2.8 percent, with job growth expected to reach an increase of 44.4 percent in the next 10 years. These circumstances have set the stage for the healthcare industry to expand and thrive in a multitude of ways. As there is an increase in homeowners and residents within the area. the need for healthcare expansion to cater to a larger community is necessary. Currently, there are a variety of developmental projects underway. This includes new hospitals, clinics and rehabilitation sites, along with healthcare industry collaborations, expanding facilities and new available treatment plans.



Ascension St. Vincent's St. Johns County

St. Johns County is one of the fastestgrowing populations in the region. With a larger community comes a larger need for healthcare services. Ascension St. Vincent's has broken ground on its fourth Northeast Florida hospital in St. Johns County. With an expected opening date in 2022, this will be one of two acute care hospitals in the area. At an estimated cost of \$115 million, the hospital will be built on a 150,000-squarefoot expanse and will house up to 56 beds. Services will include emergency services, hospitalization, cardiovascular care, orthopaedics and musculoskeletal care, general surgical services, laboratory and imaging services. The new hospital will also include an intensive care unit that will hold a total of eight beds.

Baptist HealthPlace at Fleming Island

Baptist Health has expanded its healthcare services in Clay County. Last year Baptist Health purchased an 11-acre VyStar Credit Union property and built a new Baptist HealthPlace location on Fleming Island, adjacent to its current Baptist Clay Medical Campus. "With VyStar's 11 additional acres, our new hospital encompasses more than 40 acres, giving us room to expand to meet the health needs of the growing Clay County community," Baptist Clay hospital president, Darin Roark, stated. The new 86,000-square-foot facility opened in Fall 2021.

Brooks Rehabilitation Bartram Campus

Brooks Rehabilitation has set out to provide an outreach of inpatient rehabilitation services within the Jacksonville region. The construction of a new hospital in the Bartram Park area within the preexisting 115-acre campus aims to meet increasing demands of the surrounding

community. The Bartram facility's new addition will offer care that includes post brain and spinal cord injury, stroke and any other impairing injury. Brooks Rehabilitation has an expansive reach over the Jacksonville area, often partnering with other hospitals and providing rehabilitation services to more than 3,000 patients at Brooks on University Boulevard annually. The new hospital will continue the growth of Brooks' expansive inpatient rehabilitation services that feature cutting edge technology, a variety of clinical experts and effective treatment plans. Once constructed, the new hospital is expected to open in 2022, with an estimated 150 staff to be employed.

Encompass Health

To provide the First Coast community with comprehensive physical rehabilitative services, Encompass Health plans to build a state-of-the-art 50-bed inpatient rehabilitation hospital on Jacksonville's southside. The hospital will provide speech, occupational and physical therapy

services and provide 24-hour care by registered nurses. It will also care for patients recovering from illnesses and injuries including strokes and other neurological disorders, brain injuries, spinal cord injuries, amputations and complex orthopaedic conditions. The Jacksonville location plans to begin seeing patients in the second half of 2022.

Flagler Health+ and UF Health Collaboration

A new age of healthcare is being ushered in by recent collaborations between industries and enterprises. Flagler Health+ sets its intentions on working with UF Health to bring forth a fresh concept of health and wellness to Durbin Park in St. Johns County. UF Health is widely known for its health colleges, research and institutions. As such, Flagler Health+ sets its sites on expanding with UF Health with the commitment of providing advanced health services to the Northeast Florida community.

In an informal agreement of collaboration, both parties display interest in building clinics, starting new residency programs, and offering new educational prospects for residents and those seeking fellowships. Flagler Health+ has already taken initiative by purchasing 40 acres of Durbin Park Development from GATE Lands. Plans of a health campus, ambulatory medical services and other medical facilities are being discussed.

Orange Park Medical Center

In March 2021, Orange Park Medical Center completed a 101.435-squarefoot expansion which added a fivestory patient tower, outpatient testing, a dining room, kitchen, medical office building, electrophysiology lab and neonatal intensive care unit. Now. Orange Park Medical Center will become the fifth-largest hospital in Northeast Florida in 2023 when its 34-million-dollar expansion is complete. Bringing the bed count to 408, the hospital continues to provide the highest level of care for its patients. The addition will add 20 intensive care unit beds and 48 private patient rooms as well as a 300-space parking lot. Each patient room is being upgraded with state-of-the-art clinical communication technology, including high-speed internet access and 50-inch TVs equipped with Apple TV. This expansion will also provide the community with an additional 80 jobs in the hospital.

Medical **Tourism**

With many high-profile healthcare facilities on the First Coast, it is easy to see why many people from around the nation and world travel to the area for medical care. There is a multitude of medical services from transplants, dialysis, pediatrics, bariatric surgery to cancer treatment, cardiac health and advanced rehabilitation services.

As home to Baptist MD Anderson Cancer Center, Mayo Clinic, UF Health Proton Therapy Institute and Wolfson Children's Hospital, the area offers many top healthcare options.

Many research and residency collaborations with the University of Florida, University of North Florida, Jacksonville University and Florida State College at Jacksonville also contribute to the medical success of the area.

Skilled Nursing Facilities



These hospital-like facilities also provide short-term

services for those recovering from an injury or illness, or long-term services for those who have a serious medical condition and need more extensive care. Memory care facilities are specialized types of skilled nursing facilities that accommodate seniors with Alzheimer's, dementia and other types of memory problems.

Retirement Communities

These types of communities are best for seniors who can still live independently. Retirement communities include active adult communities, independent living communities and 55-plus communities. Seniors can choose from a multitude of housing options like single-family homes, condos or apartments. While each community is unique, most have several amenities and conveniences such as fitness centers, pools, golf courses, transportation and a restaurant on site. These communities allow seniors to maintain their independence and freedom while still offering some assistance with housekeeping and meal preparation if needed. Many retirement communities also have an assisted living component.



A Driving Force of the Economy

With more than 100 industry headquarters in the area, the First Coast draws many different business sectors from all over. As one of the fastest-growing areas for businesses in the country, this area is an affordable option for businesses as there are no taxes on corporate franchises, inventory, foreign or personal income. The average commute time of 26.5 minutes, which is less than any other major city, is another desirable reason to call this city home.

The city ranks as one of the best places for both careers and businesses and boasts three Fortune 500 companies, four Fortune 1000 companies and a labor force of more than 845,000. The city ranks No. 4 for the best state to start a business according to Wallethub and MoneyGeek ranked Jacksonville No. 3 for the best city for job seekers.

Florida has 10 airports that offer more than 95 non-stop flights daily to major U.S. cities, more than 130 public-use airports, 20 commercial airports and 15 deep-water seaports to maintain trade between multiple countries. Local seaports contribute \$117 billion to the economy and 900,000 jobs in the state.

The tech industry in the area has boomed to the point that *Bloomberg* and LinkedIn stated that Jacksonville is ranking No. 4 as the preferred destination for tech workers. This places Jacksonville ahead of some larger cities like San Francisco and Seattle. Both e-commerce and fintech have had higher growth rates in Jacksonville and more than 13 e-commerce companies have settled on the First Coast in the last five years.

More than 20 major banks, insurance and investment service firms on the Fortune Global 500 list have operations on the First Coast. With considerable growth as a financial focal point, this sector has become a financial powerhouse.

First Coast **Businesses** Are Booming!

The First Coast is the best place to do business. Companies continue to relocate and expand here, and it's clear why. In addition to being centered around our deep-water ports, the First Coast region has a young, vibrant and highly skilled workforce. Below are just a few businesses that have been experiencing growth and new projects.

Amazon

Amazon continues to increase



its presence on the First Coast. Construction for another Amazon fulfillment center at AllianceFlorida at Cecil Commerce Center is complete. Known as JAX9, the almost 280,000-square-foot facility serves as a sortation center and created about 260 jobs.

Amazon's nearly 1.1 million-squarefoot fulfillment center at Imeson Park on the Northside of Jacksonville recently opened and has created 500 new full-time jobs. Down in St. Johns County, Amazon is developing another last-mile delivery center known as DJX6. The new warehouse and distribution center will span about 125,000 square feet.

Boeing

Boeing recently broke ground on a new 370,000-square-foot maintenance, repair and overhaul facility at Cecil Airport that will help the company deliver readiness outcomes for U.S. government customers. The facility will feature eight new airplane hangars, as well as additional workspace and offices where mechanics, engineers and data analysts will support the needs of military aircraft. The project will

Saint-Gobain North America

Saint-Gobain North America is planning to



construct a new gypsum logistics facility through its building products subsidiary CertainTeed. The facility will repurpose an unused Superfund site along the St. Johns River in Jacksonville, Until 1978, the site belonged to Kerr-McGee Chemical Corporation. The new facility will support CertainTeed's wallboard plant in nearby Palatka and bolster its supply chain throughout the Southeast.

Over the next few years, this project will create 32 jobs and cost an estimated \$70 million. Once the facility is operational, it will be equipped with a bulkhead, a conveyor, an unloading ramp, truck staging areas and an office space. Construction is expected to begin in 2022.

Cecil Commerce Center

Cecil Commerce Center, located on the Westside of Jacksonville, is one of the most sought-after locations in the Southeastern U.S. for manufacturing and supply chain logistics. Zoned for

industrial and commercial use, this site offers mid- to large-size parcels for development. The center has a wonderful transportation and utility infrastructure, is close to I-10, and is home to the third-longest runway in the state. All these features are attracting large companies that bring thousands of jobs to the First Coast. In the past few years, companies such as General Electric (now known as Baker Hughes), FedEx, Bridgestone, Wayfair, Northrop Grumman and Amazon have opened extensive operations here.

Malnove, one of the top independent folding carton manufacturers in the country, is growing its plant in North Jacksonville. The \$7.4 million expansion will create 10 new jobs and retain the company's current 182 employees. Malnove makes packaging products for a wide range of clients and customers, mostly in the packaged foods industry.

Automotive Industry Expansions

With consumer demand for automobiles increasing, the First Coast continues to draw in large retailers throughout the automotive supply chain. E-commerce retailers like 1A Auto and Carparts.com have added distribution centers right here in Jacksonville. The companies join major brands such as Volkswagen, BMW and Mercedes-Benz, as well as industrial battery manufacturer Saft, which all have distribution centers here on the First Coast.







With a long history as a military and veteran-friendly area, the First Coast has the third-largest military presence in the country and is home to more than 50,000 active-duty, reserve and civilian contractors stationed at the area's three naval bases, Naval Air Station Jacksonville, Naval Station Mayport and Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay. The United States Coast Guard Sector Jacksonville, Camp Blanding Army Base and Marine Corps Blount Island Command also call the First Coast home. The Navy is an important provider to the local economy, generating more than \$10 billion annually. Every year, the First Coast holds the largest Veterans Day Parade in the state of Florida and other various veteran geared events. With a great military presence in the area, many businesses are veteran-owned as well as veteran-employed.

Situated at the mouth of the St. Johns River and the Atlantic Ocean, Naval Station Mayport (NS Mayport) is located near the small village of Mayport. As one of the three major Navy Installations on the First Coast, it is the third-largest naval facility in the continental U.S. and also home to the Navy's 4th Fleet. Holding up to 34 ships, the naval station's harbor and facility cover more than 3,400 acres and include an 8,000-foot runway that can accommodate any type of Department of Defense aircraft. With more than 100,000 helicopter and fixed-wing flights each year, the airfield is operated by NS Mayport's Air Operations Department. For both active-duty and civilian contractors, the NS Mayport Morale, Welfare and Recreation Department provide facilities, services and activities both on and off of the base.



Naval Air Station Jacksonville 6801 Roosevelt Blvd., Jacksonville www.cnic.navv.mil/iacksonville

As home to the famous Blue Angels, known for their exciting aerial maneuvers, Naval Air Station Jacksonville (NAS Jacksonville) is the largest Navy base in the Southeast and is located on the Westside of Jacksonville on the St. Johns River. At \$2.1 billion, the regional impact of the base is a large part of the area's economy. NAS Jacksonville covers 4,000 acres and is an operational headquarters for more than 100 tenant commands. The Patrol Squadron Thirty (VP-30), the largest squadron in the Navy, is found at NAS Jacksonville. The base is a recipient of a 2012 Presidential Excellence Award and 2013 Commander, Navy Installations Command Excellence Award. It is home to Naval Hospital Jacksonville, Naval Facilities Engineering Command Southeast, Fleet Logistics Center, Fleet Readiness Center Southeast, Navy Region Southeast, the Commander and the Naval Supply Fleet Logistics Center.



Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay 1063 USS Tennessee Ave., Kings Bay, GA www.cnic.navy.mil/kingsbay

Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay is located approximately 38 miles away from Jacksonville, adjacent to the city of St. Marys in Georgia. This base is the home port for the U.S. Navy Fleet ballistic missile nuclear submarines that are capable of being equipped with the Trident missile. The base covers more than 16,000 acres with 4,000 of those acres as protected wetlands. For those living on base, there are many programs offered through Morale, Welfare and Recreation including dining, childcare, bowling and a golf course. The major base commands include the Strategic Weapons Facility Atlantic, Trident Refit Facility, Trident Training Facility, Submarine Group 10 and the Naval Submarine Support Center. Currently, on the base there are eight Ohio-class submarines including two guided missiles and six ballistic missiles.

As the sub-office to the United States Coast Guard 7th District Headquarters in Miami, Sector Jacksonville is accountable for 40,000 square miles of ocean and island waterways and is located on six acres of land close to NS Mayport. The President of the United States can transfer resources from the Coast Guard to the Department of the Navy during times of war and is considered military service. Sector Jacksonville spans 190 miles of coastline starting at Kings Bay, Georgia to Port Malabar, Florida. Station Cape Canaveral, Station Ponce de Leon Inlet and Multi-Mission Mayport and Security Detachment Mayport are used on base.

Blount Island Command Center operated by the logistics base of the Marine Corps located in Albany, Georgia is one of the largest U.S. bases built for the Marines. Located in Jacksonville, the base was created as a logistics base for maintenance operations of maritime ships. The base plans, organizes and executes logistics techniques of ships that are used for both philanthropic and military purposes. As a logistics base, it has a 1,000-foot pier and maintenance operation area, a slipway with space for giving vessel berths and more than 33 acres for storage.

The camp has been used as a domestic and combat training facility in the Southeast United States, focuses on Unified Land Operations and offers training to Unified Action Partners. As a logistical support base during emergency operations and as a joint reception, staging and onward integration site, the base has been used for multiple federal homeland and overseas operations.

The largest container port in Florida and one of the nation's largest vehiclehandling ports, Jacksonville Port Authority (JAXPORT) is known as the global gateway to Florida. JAXPORT's international seaport offers global cargo service from several ocean carriers, including direct service with Asia, Europe. Africa, South America, the Caribbean and other major markets. Comprised of three marine terminals. Blount Island, Dames Point and Talleyrand, shippers can utilize the port to ship to 140 ports in 70 countries via the 100 trucking firms or the 40 daily trains. The port is working to deepen the shipping channel from the Atlantic Ocean to the Dames Pointe Marine Terminal from 40 feet to 47 feet before the end of 2022.

The **Blount Island Marine Terminal** is JAXPORT's largest marine facility, as well as one of the

largest vehicle import/export centers in the U.S. **Dames Point Marine** has 5,002 linear feet of deep-water berths, as well as six new Panamax container cranes. **Talleyrand Marine Terminal** mostly deals with containerized and breakbulk cargo, automobiles, and liquid bulk commodities.

Port of Fernandina

The **Port of Fernandina** is a natural deep-water port that handles a variety of cargoes, such as steel, aluminum, machinery, paper and forest products

and consumer goods. The 950-foot turning basin directly adjoins the 1,200-linear-foot pier. The port also features 250,000 square feet of warehouse space on-site, 100,000-plus square feet of off-port space, as well as 10 acres of open storage.



E-PASS is run by the Central Florida Expressway Authority. The E-PASS sticker is free but must be loaded with \$10 to activate. E-PASS is available to purchase online, over the phone or at the E-PASS Service Center in Orlando.

First Coast Expressway

This multi-lane, limited-access toll road will cross parts of Duval, Clay and St. Johns counties. Those with a SunPass will be able to pass through electronic toll gantries without stopping. The tolls on the First Coast Expressway are:

- I-10 to N. Argyle Forest Blvd.
- N. Argyle Forest Blvd. to Blanding Blvd.
- SR 21 to North of SR 16
- North of SR 16 to East of CR 209

- New St. Johns River Bridge
- East of CR 16A Spur to I-95

Those who do not pay the toll will be charged a toll-by-plate fee.

I-295 Express Lanes

The express toll lanes on I-295 West stretch over four miles starting at I-95 to the Buckman Bridge. Express lane construction along I-295 from JTB to SR 9B is still ongoing. PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

Jacksonville Transportation Authority (JTA) www.jtafla.com

JTA provides various mass transit services for the public in Duval County, including paratransit for the disabled and elderly, and Ride Request on-demand services.

Bus – JTA manages all bus services in the greater Jacksonville area. The JTA website features updated information about each route daily, including a specific time for each stop, making it more convenient than ever to take public transportation.

Connexion (Paratransit) -

The paratransit service provides destination-to-destination shared transportation for disabled and disadvantaged individuals. JTA provides this service to supplement fixed bus routes around the city in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Connexion Plus is for eligible customers who want private, same-day, door-to-door service anywhere in Duval County.



Park-n-Ride — Created to make going to downtown Jacksonville a breeze, this coordinated JTA effort has designated lots around the city with express service to downtown. The Stadium Shuttle provides transportation to and from the stadium for major sporting events. These buses run continuously so whenever you're ready to leave, you will have a quaranteed ride back to your car.

ReadiRide — Offered by JTA through Owl Inc., ReadiRide is an on-call service that provides affordable transportation to customers in 11 Jacksonville communities. Download the MyJTA app for more information and payment options.

Skyway – This free automated train allows riders to glide high above traffic for convenient access around downtown Jacksonville. There are

eight train stations and trains depart every four minutes during peak hours (6 to 9 a.m. and 4 to 7 p.m.) and every eight minutes during off-peak hours.





BEACHES DUVAL COUNTY

Atlantic Beach

This uncrowded beach gives numerous options for saltwater lovers looking for place to paddleboard, kayak, fish or surf.

Jacksonville Beach

More than four miles long and covering 60 blocks along the Atlantic Ocean, Jacksonville Beach is ideal for families, vacationers and surfers alike. Beachgoers can also enjoy catching some fish on Jacksonville Beach Pier. Lined by soft sand dunes, Jax Beach is a popular place for sea turtle nesting.

Mayport

North of Atlantic Beach, you'll find the charming fishing town of Mayport.
Located at the mouth of the St. Johns River, this area is well known for its shrimping industry. Beachgoers looking for camping, fishing or surfing can head to Kathryn Abbey Hanna Park, which has some of the best waves Northeast Florida has to offer.

Neptune Beach

Only about a mile long, the delightful Neptune Beach attracts residents and visitors who enjoy surfing, sunbathing, and riding bikes on the hard-packed sand.

NASSAU COUNTY

Fernandina Beach

The First Coast's northernmost beach, Fernandina Beach is well known for its horseback riding tours along the beach. There are more than 40 public beach access points along the beach's 13 miles, which are lined by sand dunes as high as 40 feet.

ST. JOHNS COUNTY

Crescent Beach

This secluded family-friendly beach lies south of St. Augustine on A1A and is named for the coastline's natural crescent shape. The beautiful hard-packed white sand makes for a fun day of beach volleyball, bike rides or horseback riding.

North Beach

St. Augustine Beach

Vilano Beach

Located on the north side of the Matanzas Inlet, Vilano Beach is a great spot for surfing, paddleboarding and skimboarding due to its heavier surf and strong current. The beach also offers access for four-wheel-drive vehicles depending on the conditions of the sand.

WATERWAYS

The Intracoastal

The Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway runs 40 miles throughout the First Coast. It splits the southside region of Jacksonville from the beach communities with its saltwater inlets, man-made canals and sounds. Many residents enjoy activities such as kayaking, fishing, boating, paddleboarding, tubing and jet skiing.

St. Johns River

The longest river in Florida runs right through the First Coast, spanning 310 miles from Mayport to Indian River County. Residents can enjoy many activities on the river, such as kayaking, boating and fishing. The

Riverwalk in downtown Jacksonville allows residents to take a stroll or jog along the beautiful river. Keep your eyes peeled for manatees or dolphins, which frequent the river.

Other First Coast Rivers

Many bodies of water throughout the First Coast provide a multitude of outdoor fun, like fishing and boating. The Tolomato and Guana rivers surround Guana Tolomato Matanzas National Estuary Research Reserve in St. Johns County, while in St. Augustine, the Matanzas Bay and Matanzas River give sight to landmarks like the Castillo de San Marcos, St. Augustine Lighthouse and Bridge of Lions. On the Amelia River, you can enjoy historic sites such as Fort Clinch State Park with radiant riverbanks and salt marshes.

What a Wonderful World: State Parks & Preserves

With exquisite natural beauty, untouched wetlands, vast marshes and expansive forests, the First Coast is home to the largest park system in the country, full of native plants and wildlife. Gorgeous gardens, nature preserves, an arboretum, and intricate water systems grace our area with natural beauty. With more than 80,000 acres of parks including a national wildlife refuge, a national forest, nine state parks and more than 400 urban parks, amazing adventures are in store for nature lovers of all ages.



BAKER COUNTY

John M. Bethea State Forest

John M. Bethea State Forest is tucked in northern Baker County on more than 37,000 acres of beautiful land. With a variety of species in the area, the forest provides a wildlife corridor between the Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge and Osceola National Forest.

Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge

Located just over the state line in Georgia, the Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge encompasses more than 400,000 acres of land including the Okefenokee Swamp, which is full of more than 400 species of wildlife including black bears, alligators, sandhill cranes and even the threatened gopher tortoise. The wildlife refuge allows for camping, biking and hiking on trails, as well as boat tours.

Osceola National Forest

The peaceful Osceola National Forest, just west of Jacksonville, is a sprawling natural gem with swamps and flatwoods full of many species of marine life, birds and other animals. The 237,000-acre forest has several wildlife corridors that lead towards Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge. The forest is perfect for those looking to fish, hunt, hike, swim and camp.

CLAY COUNTY

Jennings State Forest

Jennings State Forest is located in north Clay County and spans more than 25,300 acres. The forest has many different ecosystems present including flatwoods, swamps, marshes, sandhills and a blackwater stream. Various activities are available to visitors including hiking, biking, camping, fishing and horseback riding.


Mike Roess Gold Head Branch State Park

Developed on a 600-acre site in the 1930s, Mike Roess Gold Head Branch State Park is one of Florida's first state parks. Now visitors can enjoy more than 2,000 acres of marshes, lakes, sandhills, flatwoods and scrub. The Florida National Scenic Trail offers wildlife viewing and hiking with a 5.44 mile stretch of exploration. Little Lake Johnson is a great place to canoe, fish or swim and a picnic area is available to enjoy lunch.

DUVAL-BEACHES

Kathryn Abbey Hanna Park

This 500-acre oceanfront park is located between Atlantic Beach and Mayport with 1.5 miles of beautiful beaches. With a 60-acre lake available for use, visitors can fish, kayak, canoe or even use pedal boats. Bike trails, campgrounds, hiking and ecotours are also popular activities in the park.



DUVAL-NORTH

Amelia Island State Park

Amelia Island State Park is a nature lover's dream with beautiful beaches, maritime forests and salt marshes. A beachside park is a perfect place for horseback riding, and the white sandy beach is a popular place to search for seashells and shark's teeth.

Big Talbot Island State Park

Those looking for the ideal hike will love Big Talbot Island State Park where visitors can hike several different trails leading to the shoreline, marsh or maritime forest. Kayaks are available for rent with guided tours and the area is also a fisherman's paradise. Boneyard Beach is famous for skeletons of live oak and cedar trees that once grew on the shoreline. The Timucuan Trail runs parallel to A1A with a 3.9-mile paved path perfect for biking, walking or running. The park is a migratory home to many shorebirds like the Least Tern and Little Blue Heron, two species currently on the threatened species list in Florida.

Fort George Island Cultural State Park

Occupied for more than 5,000 years, the park was named after a 1736 fort originally built on the grounds to defend the area when it was a colony. In the 1920s, the Ribault Club was built originally as a resort. It is now used as a visitor center for the park, a meeting space, and for special events. Visitors can boat, fish, kayak and hike the island, exploring this cultural gem.

George Crady Bridge Fishing Pier State Park

This pedestrian-only mile-long bridge in Jacksonville is a fisherman's dream. Depending on the season, anglers can find a variety of species in the water including tarpon, redfish, whiting and jack.

Little Talbot Island State Park

As one of the last remaining barrier islands on the First Coast, Little Talbot Island State Park has beautiful sprawling white beaches, salt marshes and coastal ecosystems. Both migratory and native wildlife can be found in the park including many birds, otters, raccoons, opossums, bobcats and more. Visitors can rent kayaks, visit campsites and even enjoy guided paddle tours.

Pumpkin Hill Creek Preserve State Park

Pumpkin Hill Creek Preserve State
Park is an important ecosystem for
many different species of wildlife
dependent on the longleaf pine
flatwoods in the park that protect
the water quality, allowing aquatic
plants and animals to prosper. Several
threatened species can be found in the
park including the American alligator.
With more than 15 miles of trails,
hikers and equestrians can enjoy the
trails and salt marsh.

Timucuan Ecological and Historic Preserve

The Timucuan Ecological and Historic Preserve is full of history, leading back to the original people of the area, the Timucua. The preserve includes Fort Caroline and Kingsley Plantation, two national historic sites. With more than 46,000 acres, the preserve encompasses the St. Johns River as well as multiple tributaries drawing a variety of plant and animal life to this ecological treasure. Full of coastal dunes, wetlands, salt marshes and hardwood hammocks. the environment is varied with hiking trails of different experience levels as well as monuments and structures outlining the history of the area.

NASSAU COUNTY

Cary State Forest

Located in Northeast Florida, Cary State Forest was established in 1937 as the state's second forest. Eleven ecosystems make up the forest with flatwoods, marshes, sandhills, swamps and cypress encompassing the area. Keep your binoculars handy to see if you are able to find some endangered and threatened wildlife like the Sherman's fox squirrel, gopher tortoise and wood stork. Camping, horseback riding, hunting and hiking are available for visitors.

Four Creeks State Forest

Named after the four water systems located within more than 10,000 acres, this state forest has Boggy Creek, Plummer Creek, Thomas Creek and Alligator (Mills) Creek. With all of the water, fishing and kayaking are popular activities. Visitors can also hike the trails and bike throughout the area.

ST. JOHNS COUNTY

Anastasia State Park

Those looking for the perfect getaway in St. Johns County can take a quick trip to Anastasia State Park, with more than 1,600 acres of tidal marshes, sand dunes, hammocks and beaches. The area offers campsites, biking, fishing and more. Various hiking areas can be found in the park like the Ancient Dunes Nature Trail and Cape Francis Beach Walk. Also located in

the park is the Great Florida Birding and Wildlife Trail, where many shore and wading birds can be spotted.

Faver-Dykes State Park

Situated on the edge of St. Augustine, Faver-Dykes State Park is the perfect place to camp, fish, kayak and canoe on the tranquil Pellicer Creek. With more than 100 species of native and migratory birds found in the forest, tidal marshes and creeks, and native wildlife like deer, raccoons, opossums, otters and hawks, the park is the perfect place for nature lovers.

Guana Tolomato Matanzas National Estuarine Research Reserve

More than 76,700 acres of natural land can be found in this estuary. As one of 29 in the nation, the estuary

is a connection for freshwater and saltwater to mix together creating a diverse habitat for many species. More than nine miles of nature trails, fishing and kayaking are available for quests.

Matanzas State Forest

Protected by the Matanzas National Estuarine Research Reserve, this area is home to the last remaining undisturbed salt marshes within the reserve. The forest includes a 20-acre connection linked to Moses Creek Conservation Area and covers 4,699 acres. This conservation corridor crosses into Moses Creek, Faver-Dykes State Park and Pellicer Creek. Visitors can spend the day hiking through the forest uplands and enjoy the beauty of the wetlands including an expansive cypress swamp.



A Step Back in Time: Historical Sites and Museums

To understand what makes the First Coast such a great place to live, it's important to know the rich history of those who lived here long ago. Long before the area was colonized by European settlers, the Timucuan people called Northeast Florida home. For over 1,000 years, the Timucuan tribes lived in various communities along the waterways in North and Central Florida, as well as southeastern Georgia. Archeologists have even discovered some of the oldest remnants of pottery in the United States, dating to 2500 B.C. in the Timucuan Ecological and Historic Preserve.



In 1513, Spanish conquistador Juan Ponce de León landed on the banks of Northeast Florida and claimed the land for Spain. Inspired by the lush landscape, Ponce de León named the area La Florida.

In 1562, the French Huguenots, led by Jean Ribault, claimed the land near the St. Johns River and traveled north to what is presently known as South Carolina. The colony they established was not prosperous and failed. Ribault's second-incommand, René Goulaine de Laudonnière, took settlers from South Carolina back to Florida. In 1564, he founded Fort Caroline, but the next year the fort was destroyed by orders of the Spanish Governor of Florida, Pedro Menéndez de Avilés. These disasters led up to the creation of a new city, St. Augustine, which was originally the site of the Timucuan village, Seloy. The city was rebuilt several times after being

attacked during wars. To keep the city of Havana, Spain gave most of its Florida territory to the British at the end of the Seven Years' War.

After their defeat in the American Revolutionary War, Britain returned control of the Florida territory to Spain in 1783 via the Peace of Paris. Around this time, downtown Jacksonville was known as Cowford because there was a place in the St. Johns River that was both shallow and narrow enough for cattle to cross.

In 1821, Spain ceded the Florida Territory to the United States. American settlers on the north side of Cowford decided to plan a town and began laying out the streets and plats. Eventually, the name was changed to Jacksonville after Andrew Jackson, who would go on to become the seventh president of the United States.

With a booming population of 17,201 in 1890, Jacksonville continued to be a popular city and grew to 57,699 residents by 1910. The St. Johns River became a large transporter of goods and passengers. It allowed access to the ocean to cross the sea, which assisted in facilitating commerce, enhanced security and recreation.

The area also began to become a prime vacation spot, with untouched beaches and warm weather. The First Coast's popularity also brought a drove of people looking to relocate and a population boom began. The area's growth in the 20th century can also be attributed to the presence of its growing Navy bases.

BAKER COUNTY

Olustee Battlefield Historic State Park 5815 Battlefield Trail Rd., Olustee www.floridastateparks.org/parks-and-trails/ olustee-battlefield-historic-state-park

This site pays tribute to the Battle of Olustee, the largest Civil War battle in Florida. On Feb. 20, 1864, more than 10,000 cavalry, infantry and artillery troops fought for almost five hours. After 2,807 casualties were tallied, the Union soldiers retreated to Jacksonville. The Union forces included the famous 54th Massachusetts Infantry, a unit of African American troops featured in the 1989 film *Glory*. Some scenes for the movie were even filmed at Olustee. Each February, a reenactment is held to honor those that were part of the battle.

Heritage Park Village 102 S. Lowder St., Macclenny heritagepark.cityofmacclenny.com

Visitors to this park can meander through the paths that lead to several small museums that showcase Baker County's settlers in the 1800s. These museums include a barber and blacksmith shop, trading post, train depot and jail.

Take a step back in time to see what life was like in Clay County in the early 20th century. The museum has 20th-century artifacts including tools, clothing, furniture, photographs and personal letters.

This memorial shares the story of the settlement at Fort Caroline established in 1564 by the French Huguenots that was eventually captured by the Spanish. During a hurricane, the first replica of the fort was destroyed, much like the hurricane that was a factor in the fate of the Huguenots.

Norman Studios 6337 Arlington Rd., Jacksonville www.normanstudios.org

Located in Jacksonville's Old Arlington neighborhood, Norman Studios is Jacksonville's only surviving silent film studio complex and is a remnant of Jacksonville's heyday as the Winter Film Capital of the World.

Ribault Club, The 11241 Fort George Rd., Jacksonville www.theribaultclub.com

The Ribault Club was established in 1928 and was the site of many soirces and parties for the affluent. Located on Fort George Island, it currently houses a museum depicting its history.

Yellow Bluff Fort Historic State Park New Berlin Rd., Jacksonville www.floridastateparks.org

Though there was never an actual fort, an armed and fortified encampment was built at this historic site. When construction began in 1862, the site was occupied by both Confederate and Union troops during the Civil War and at its peak, housed more than 250 soldiers. Visitors can picnic in an authentic reproduction of the encampment.

Brumos Collection, The 5159 San Pablo Rd. S., Jacksonville www.thebrumoscollection.com

This exquisite collection houses some of the finest automobiles in the world and tells the story of their rich history. The first section of the museum features open cockpit racers and early automotive innovations, and the second portion displays Porsche race cars from 1953 to 2017.

This museum encourages hands-on learning through educational exhibits for children ages 1 through 12.

Mandarin Museum & Historical Society 11964 Mandarin Rd., Jacksonville www.mandarinmuseum.net

Located in the Walter Jones Historical Park, this museum allows visitors to catch a glimpse of old historic Florida. Visitors can learn about author and abolitionist Harriet Beecher Stowe who settled in Mandarin in 1867. The Civil War steamship exhibit of the Maple Leaf is also on display. On the property is the St. Joseph's Mission Schoolhouse for African American Children, which is the only remaining one-room schoolhouse in Duval County. Visitors can also stop by the Historic Store and Post Office located nearby.

Northeast Florida's only science and history museum inspires visitors young and old through its interactive exhibits and educational programs. The museum's Bryan-Gooding Planetarium brings the cosmos and night skies to life.

This campground immerses visitors into the Civil War era with its historical reenactments. On the property is an authentic 1800s Florida farmstead and an education center that houses Civil War artifacts.

The Durkeeville community was founded in the 1930s for African Americans during Jacksonville's period of racial segregation. This museum tells the story of Durkeeville through exhibits and historical artifacts.

The museum is a memorial to Clara White, a former slave who fed her hungry neighbors out of her two-room house in the 1880s. Her daughter, Eartha, worked alongside her mother to provide for the community. This was the beginning of a fully running mission.

The Great Fire of 1901 wiped out most of downtown Jacksonville, destroying 2,368 buildings. The museum displays photos of the fire, as well as a restored 1902 American LaFrance horse-drawn fire engine and working 1926 American LaFrance fire engine.

As one of the few Karpeles Museums in the country, this location on the First Coast preserves historic artwork, documents and writings from renowned authors, scientists, composers, philosophers and leaders throughout world history.

Operated by the Jacksonville Historical Society, this unique museum portrays what life in Jacksonville was like at the turn of the 20th century.

Visitors to this museum can peruse exhibits on military and civilian life during the Civil War. On display is a Lincoln-era 37-Star Applegate Flag and a diorama of the Battle of Olustee.

This museum celebrates the period from the 1920s to the 1960s in the LaVilla neighborhood, known as the "Harlem of the South." Father Francisco López de Mendoza Grajales presented Don Pedro Menéndez de Avilés with a cross to kiss once he stepped foot onto what is now known as St. Augustine. The Cathedral Basilica was built to keep the sacred spiritual history alive.

The former Hotel Ponce de León is now home to Flagler College. The college was built in 1888 by millionaire developer, Henry Flagler, and boasts Spanish Renaissance-style architecture that can be seen throughout the area.

Built by the Spanish in 1742 to guard Matanzas Inlet, visitors can watch reenactments and learn about the battles fought here. The fort was named after the inlet, which acquired its name after the massacre (matanzas in Spanish) of the French Huguenots in 1565.
